Bus your Bike

All Blue Water Transit buses and all SMART buses are equipped with bicycle racks at the front of the bus.

Passengers load and unload their own bicycles.

Transfers in and around Port Huron

Most transfers occur at the Port Huron Transit Center on Michigan St. Buses serve Port Huron, Marysville and Fort Gratiot Township.

Transfer to/from SMART

SMART is the regional bus system serving Wayne, Oakland and Macomb Counties. Transfer from Blue Water Route M-29 to SMART Route 560 and 565 at 23 Mile and Gratiot.

Blue Water transfers are accepted by SMART for up to two bus rides.

SMART fare when coming back from metro Detroit is \$1.50 plus \$0.25 for a transfer. Blue Water Transit accepts SMART transfers for up to two bus rides.

SMART Route 560/565 provides service to Mt. Clemens, Macomb Mall and downtown Detroit. Macomb Mall is the transfer point for most east side SMART bus routes.

To Metro Airport via Bus

Take Blue Water Route M-29, pay your fare and ask for a transfer. At 23/Gratiot transfer to SMART Route 560 or 565. In downtown Detroit, transfer on Woodward Avenue to SMART Route 125 which serves Metro Airport.

SMART Route 125 buses serve either the Smith or McNamara terminal and the airport has free shuttle service between the two terminals. The bus runs every half hour.

From Metro Airport via Bus

To return to the Blue Water area, board the SMART bus at Metro Airport and pay \$1.50 plus \$0.25 for a transfer. In downtown Detroit, on Larned St. east of Woodward (behind City Hall), transfer to SMART route 560 or 565.

At 23 Mile and Gratiot, transfer to Blue Water Transit Route M-29.
